MEET THE 2023 EAGLES



Gen (RET) John "Jay" Raymond, USSF

General (Ret) John "Jay" Raymond was selected as an Eagle for his outstanding contributions to air and space power as the first Chief of Space Operations, United States Space Force. Responsible for standing up the newest branch of armed service since 1947, he was a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and acted as a key military advisor to the Secretary of Defense and the US President. He also planned, established, and served as the first Commander of United States Space Command and as the only nonrated officer selected as the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations in the United States Air Force's history. His leadership was instrumental in ensuring US readiness to conduct global space operations that enhance the way our joint and coalition forces fight.

LT GEN (RET) STAYCE HARRIS, USAF

Lt Gen Stayce Harris was selected as an Eagle for her significant contributions to Airpower and Air Mobility. She has more than 2,500 hours in C-130J, KC-135R, C-141B/C, T-38, and T-37. She's also deployed in numerous operations throughout her 36 year Air Force career. This trailblazer hosts a list of first throughout her distinguished military career, including being the first Black Woman to earn 3-Star in the Air Force; to serve as the Inspector General of the Air Force; to command a Numbered Air Force; to command a flying wing; and to command an operational flying squadron.





CH Maj Gen (Ret) Charles Baldwin

CH Maj Gen (Ret) Charles Baldwin was selected as an Eagle for his outstanding contributions to Airpower, specifically to the Chaplain Corps and caring for Airmen.. Originally, he flew the EC-121 Warning Star and then volunteered to re-train and fly the HH-53 Super Jolly as a rescue pilot serving out of Da Nang Air Base from 1972-73. Ch Baldwin was at the Pentagon on September 11th, where he witnessed the fireball and ministered to the wounded on site in the immediate aftermath of the attacks. He retired in 2008 after serving as the AF Chief of Chaplains.



Brig Gen (Ret) Weldon "Blackjack" Honeycutt

Brig Gen (Ret) Weldon "Blackjack" Honeycutt was selected as an Eagle for his outstanding contributions to Aipower. While serving in the Army, he led tactics development in the Air Mobile concept during the Vietnam Conflict. He also designed, recruited, trained, and equipped one of the first complete Aviation Task forces in Vietnam. Blackjack taught notable General Officers to fly and solo, to include Gen William Westmoreland, Gen Melvin Zais and many others.

CAPT VICTOR J. GLOVER, JR.


Captain Victor J. Glover, Jr. was selected as an Eagle for his numerous contributions to air and space. He is a NASA astronaut, a Navy F-18/AF Test Pilot, and pilot for NASA's SpaceX Crew-1 mission, the first crew rotational flight of a U.S. commercial spacecraft with astronauts to the International Space Station (ISS) from November 15, 2020 to May 2, 2021. He is the first African American with a long duration stay on the ISS. He completed 168 days in orbit and participated in four spacewalks. CAPT Glover is also selected as an Artemis mission team member for the return to the moon.





COL (RET) LEROY STUTZ (POW)

Colonel (Ret) Leroy Stutz (POW) was selected as an Eagle for his outstanding contributions to aviation. He served in the KS ANG and USAF. While serving in Vietnam, he became a POW, where hw remained for 6.5 years. He was imprisoned with Robbie Risner, James Stockdale, and John McCain in the Hanoi Hilton. While serving, he received numerous medals, including two Silver Stars, two Legions of Merit, two Bronze Stars (Valor), and the Distinguished Flying Cross.



CWO (RET) RAYMOND WILSON

CWO (Ret) Raymond Wilson was selected as an Eagle for his outstanding contributions to airpower. Chief Wilson overcame adversity at the height of the civil rights movement to attain his dream of flying. He was a Huey pilot who served over a year in Vietnam and helped lead the U.S Army's transition to the HH-60 Blackhawk. Along with Vietnam, he flew in the Arab-Israeli War, operations in Nicaragua, and Operation JUST CAUSE.

PATTY WAGSTAFF

Patty Wagstaff was selected as an Eagle because she is a multitime U.S. Aerobatic medal winner, winning gold, silver, and bronze medals in international competitions for several years. In 1991, she won her first of three US National Aerobatic Championships, the first woman to win that competition. She was the International Aerobatic Club champion in 1993. The following year, her Goodrich-sponsored Extra 260 airplane was put on display next to Amelia Earhart's Lockheed Vega at the Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum. From 1988–1994, she won the Betty Skelton First Lady of Aerobatics award six times in a row. In 1996, Wagstaff was the top-scoring US pilot at the World Aerobatics Championship. In 2002, she won the Katherine and Marjorie Stinson Award. In 2004, she was elected into the National Aviation Hall of Fame.

STEAMFEST









On Monday, 22 October 2022, The Gathering of Eagles Foundation (GOEF) participated in the Montgomery Academy's Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) festival. This event hosted over kindergarten through 6th grade students to expose them to the world of science. Over 30 different organizations were in attendance to include Starbase Maxwell, Alabama Wildlife Federation, the Children's Museum of Montgomery, the Alabama Dance Theater, and more. STEAMfest allowed GOEF to hand out scholarship applications and inform parents about the science opportunities offered by the foundation. These opportunities are only made possible by generous donors in and around the community.

3-Day National Flight Academy Cruise:

The Fly Like the Blues Cruise is designed for students in 5th-12th grade, ages 17 and under. Students will plan and then fly an X-12B Triad in a six-plane formation air show over Eglin Air Force Base in Florida.

3-Day Pathfinder Space Camp:

This camp is designed for students in 4th-8th grade. Students will build a model rocket, train like an astronaut and work in mission control or launch as part of the flight crew on a simulated space mission.

6-Day Aviation Challenge:

is in Huntsville, Alabama and designed for students in 5th-12th grade ages 9-18. Trainees are immersed in the fascinating realms of flight. Students learn basic principles of aviation and put their knowledge to the test in a variety of flight simulators. Taking the role of fighter pilots, students run control systems and scenario-based missions and learn basic water and land survival skills. They also learn about careers in aviation.

6-Day U.S. Cyber Academy:

Cyber Academy is in Huntsville, Alabama and designed for students ages 12–18; must be a U.S. citizen to attend. Trainees get hands-on experience solving challenges developed in cooperation with the FBI. Students learn programming, coding, how to defend against cyber threats, build a computer, and explore cryptography and digital forensics. They also learn about careers in cyber.

Red Tail Flight Academy Discovery Program:

The Discovery Program is offered for students ages 9-18. Students will experience the thrill of flight with a Certified Flight Instructor at Moton Field, the National Historic Site of the Tuskegee Airmen. The 30-minute discovery flight will offer instruction, the opportunity to fly the plane, and tour the historic airfield.

WHAT IS STARBASE MAXWELL?

STARBASE Maxwell is a DoD Youth S.T.E.M. program that focuses on providing hands-on S.T.E.M. education to students in surrounding counties. Their main program, STARBASE 1.0, is designed for fifth-grade students. STARBASE 1.0 is our five-day, 25-hour hands-on S.T.E.M. curriculum delivered to students from their facility at Maxwell AFB. Each year, ACSC faculty, staff, spouses, and students volunteer their time and share their talent and passion for S.T.E.M. as daily presenters.
